# New Features on "Curriculum" Portion of the FIT Website



The FIT Curriculum has undergone a dozen years of development based on the needs of our facilitators and clients, changing governmental requirements and changes in society. This has been especially true in the past three years where we have introduced new titles and revised others. The "Curriculum" area of our website has been recently updated to quickly show these features. To access them, go to familyintegrity.org and click on the "Curriculum" button. A sub menu will now show three buttons: **Program, Courses,** and **Brochure.** 

**Program** starts with the overall features of the FIT program as a whole. There are eight courses in the

program, each of them standalone in their own right, but each focusing on a different major need in life. Scrolling down the page, you will find the six FIT groupings required for the FIT complete program with links to more information on each of the course.

Courses contains brief descriptions of each course and links to a related table of contents.

# Number of FIT "Peer Facilitators" nearing 50

What are Peer Facilitators? Peer facilitators are prison inmates who have been found worthy to be certified as FIT facilitators to conduct our classes to other inmates in state prisons. To be certified they have to complete the application process which includes completing the entire program as a student, going through the standard FIT leadership course with a certified FIT trainer, co-facilitate classes with that trainer, be recommended by the trainer and a local prison representative, and be approved by the official FIT board.

What kind of success have we had with peer facilitators? We have used them for years and found them to be mature, dedicated, competent, and knowledgeable. Most are serving long sentences, many with life sentences. They want to give back to their (prison) community by sharing their faith and new constructive outlook. Some of them even volunteer to be "missionaries" to other prisons lacking a FIT program by requesting a transfer for that purpose. They greatly help our program because they do not have to travel or be affected by prison events like lock-downs that prevent our regular facili-

tators from entering and conducting classes.

There are others, but the following trainers have been especially active in preparing/recommending peer facilitators. Ed White - several prisons including Tamoka, Zephyr Hills, Hardee, and Lake; Belinda Roy and Cathy Morales - Black Water River and Walton. Demand and interest is great among both prisons who

want to expand our program and prisoner-candidates who want to serve in this capacity.

## How you can Help

How can you help? Let me count the ways. Most of our cost involves supplying free books to our clients in prisons, jails, recovery houses, rescue missions, and Dream Centers. Almost none of the clients are able to pay for our quality course books. We send out thousands of them in the course of a year. Then there are the other costs. One recent day's cost to ship the books out came to \$102.01 not counting the costs of producing, storing, or handling them. Shipping supplies and providing clients with custom completion certificates adds to the cost.
